Key Stage 1: **Teamwork**


The children will be reading the story 'The Enormous Potato'.

Readathon!



Today marks the beginning of Park's Readathon! Your child has until Friday 8th July to read as many books as they can.

What we'd like you to do:

1. Your child's been given a **Readathon sponsorship card** on which to list whatever they will enjoy reading. Books, e-books, poetry, comics – anything goes! Take a look at what they plan to read, or help them complete their list of books – sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!), as well as listening to audio books.
2. **Help your child find sponsors among family and friends.** Sponsors can pay directly on line at www.readathon.org/sponsor or by cash or cheque made out to Readathon and sent to school. Please also encourage UK tax payers to tick the GiftAid box - Readathon will then be able to claim an extra 25% from the Government at no cost to the donor.

Once your child has completed their sponsored read, they need to bring their sponsorship card and any cash or cheques they have into school to give to their class teacher.

Remember: As well as encouraging pupils to read for fun, our school will get free books worth 20% of our sponsorship total – so there really is something in it for everyone.
