



Parent View Feedback October 2017

Last week we shared the responses to the statement, "My child feels safe at school."

This week we are sharing the responses for the second statement: "My child is well looked after at this

school."



The children's safety is incredibly important to us and we do all we can to make sure your child is well looked after in school and out on visits. This involves ensuring your child is looked after in our day to day work; offering our children and families additional support and reviewing our practices and procedures regularly to make sure that we take account of any changes within school or the wider community.

A couple of parents made comments about school dinners and lunchtimes when they were completing the Parent View questionnaire. In response to this a member of staff has been assigned to reviewing school lunches. She will be monitoring school meals, seeking the views of the children and liaising with the catering team and school nutritionist.

If you have any concerns that your child is not being well looked after at school, please speak to your child's class teacher or a member of the Senior Leadership Team.
