<b>Park Primary's Aims for Physical Education are to:</b>	
1.	maximise opportunities for physical activity throughout the school day and the school year
2.	increase pupils' participation in physical activity. P.E. and sport
3.	promote pupils' enjoyment of physical activity and sport
4.	improve pupils' health, strength and physical fitness
5.	reduce childhood obesity
6.	make the principles and purpose of physical education teaching clear
7.	establish expectations for teaching and support staff
8.	promote curriculum continuity, coherence and progression across the school
9.	provide guidance regarding health and safety risks associated with physical activity, P.E. and sport

An allocation of the PE staffing budget has gone towards the cost of having a specialist PE coach for the year.	The role of the PE coach is to work alongside all members of staff to raise the quality of teaching across the school. Provide a curriculum and planning to support the delivery of PE across the year. Create a PE policy that tackles childhood obesity and establishes expectations for teaching & support staff. Increased pupil participation of sport in and outside of school through organising intra school & inter school competitions, after school clubs and providing links to local clubs & organisations. To train Sport Leaders and Play Leads to promote sport and participation. Organise external coaches to come into school and work alongside other teachers to support and model how to teach sport. Park Primary has worked and built links with West Ham Foundation, Capital Kids Cricket and London Rugby League Foundation to further enhance Park's curriculum.	£8,582 (20% allocation)
Cumberland Sports Partnership	As a member of the Cumberland Sports Partnership, staff have access to CPD opportunities to develop their understanding and skills of PE. Cumberland's intra school and inter school competitions allow children to participate in competitive and inclusive sports. This has identified and challenged more able pupils. Specialist SEN support is provided to help with SEN provision in PE. Cumberland provides 3 after school clubs a year which enhances our curriculum provision.
