## Every Child Consultation

The Local Authority currently funds the 'Every Child' programme. The aim of the programme is for every child and young person in Newham to have the opportunity to have access to a rich variety of cultural and creative experiences. In school the programme currently provides:

Every Child a Musician

- music lessons for every child in Years 5 & 6;
- a gift of a musical instrument to our Year 6 children.

Every Child a Theatre Goer

- a theatre visit for every child in Year 6.

Every Child a Chess Player

- funding towards chess lessons for every child in Year 3.

There is also funding for Year 7 pupils for Every Child a Sports Person when our pupils move on to secondary school.

The Local Authority has launched a consultation regarding the Every Child programme.

Losing access to the above services would be detrimental to all of our pupils. With school budgets being cut, we do not have the funds in school to be able to provide the same opportunities to our children if the programme is withdrawn.

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## Getting to Know You

Hi my name is Rehana Begum. I am your new Family Support Worker here at Park.

### What is a Family Support Worker?

A Family Support Worker provides Early Help to families who would benefit from, or need, support early on in life to prevent an issue from escalating and becoming a concern later on in life. These issues could affect your child developmentally, socially, emotionally and physically which in turn affects their wellbeing.

A Family Support Worker can visit families at home or work with them in school to provide individual or block sessions of support.

To give your child the best possible start in life we work in partnership to build a solid foundation for your child to help them to flourish as they grow up.

### What can I do to help you and your family?

Support can be given in various ways. This could be in a practical way e.g. support in form filling for housing, benefits, schools, nurseries and doctors.

If you are going through financial difficulties, I could come with you to the local food bank which could help you throughout your time of need or if you are confident to go independently I could provide the letter for you to access the food bank.

If you are having difficulties managing your child's behaviour, if you are worried about their health/diet or toileting is hard I can sign post you to all the right places.

If you have a child with special educational needs and are struggling, I could provide support for that too e.g. finding family support groups where you can speak to other parents who are going through similar situations.



### How can I support you to support yourself?

If English is an additional language, I could signpost you to the local ESOL classes.

If you need support finding a job, I could arrange for someone from the job centre or Newham Workplace to give you an insight into the process that will be required.

If you have a 2 year old that may be eligible for Free Early Education funding, I could support you to check your eligibility and make the application.

### Is that all?

No... Sometimes we all need to have a good chat with someone and let out how we are feeling. I could come to your home or we could meet at school (whichever suits you best) and have a chat over a coffee.

### Where will you find me?

I am out in the playground every morning before school and at the end of the day too. If you come into the school office and ask for me, I will come down to speak to you if I am available or I will contact you as soon as I'm free. You can also talk to me at the Monday morning coffee mornings.

I look forward to meeting you.
