This week, Year 1 went to West Ham Park to explore signs of spring.










# Key Stage 2 Pupils at RE Conference

We would like to offer ESOL classes for parents/carers at Park, however we have not had enough families interested to start running them. If you would like to attend ESOL classes, please contact the school office.






