Due to this, we strongly discourage families from taking holiday leave during term time as this can impact a child's education and their social interaction with their peers. If you decide to take holiday leave during term time, parents and carers need to complete the term time leave form on the school website. When a family takes holiday leave during term time, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice to parents/carers. A Penalty Notice carries a fine of £60, per parent, per child.





# Parent Advice Phone-In with an Educational Psychologist (EP)

The EPS Parent Advice sessions are offered to any Newham parent or carer who would like to discuss concerns about their child with an educational psychologist (examples may include: your child's emotional well-being, challenging behaviours, learning progress, your relationship with your child or some of your own worries). The sessions aim to be supportive, confidential, and informal. Each session is 40 minutes.
