
Mrs Ttoffali's Weekly Update

If you decide to take holiday leave during term time, parents and carers need to complete the term time leave form on the school website. When a family takes holiday leave during term time, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice to parents/carers. A Penalty Notice carries a fine of £60, per parent, per child.






