Park reminders

- Park is part of the Healthy School Streets scheme. PLEASE switch off your engine as soon as you have parked, even if you are waiting inside the vehicle. We all need to do our bit to ensure that children are breathing the cleanest air possible. No idling engines please.
- Please label all of your child's resources with a marker pen. In the summer, the children take off jumpers and cardigans and they are more likely to be found/ reunited with their owner if they are labelled. This applies to water bottles, sun cream and hats. Thank you.
- Dogs are only allowed on the school site if they are held in the arms of the owner or if they are acting as a guide for their owner. If you have a large dog, please wait at the back gate with

your dog and we will facilitate your child/ children's release from their teacher. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Key advice from DfE guidance:

Protecting children outdoors

During periods of high temperature, the following steps should be taken:

- children should not take part in vigorous physical activity on very hot days, such as when temperatures are in excess of 30°C
- encourage children playing outdoors to stay in the shade as much as possible
- children should wear loose, light-coloured clothing to help keep cool and sun hats with wide brims to avoid sunburn
- use sunscreen (at least factor 15 with UVA protection) to protect skin if children are playing or taking lessons outdoors for more than 20 minutes
- provide children with plenty of water (such as water from a cold tap) and encourage them to drink more than usual when conditions are hot

Protecting children indoors

During periods of high temperature, the following steps should be taken:

- open windows as early as possible in the morning, or preferably overnight to allow stored heat to escape from the building – it is important to check insurance conditions and the need for security if windows are to be left open overnight
- almost close windows when the outdoor air becomes warmer than the air indoors – this should help keep the heat out while allowing adequate ventilation
- close indoor blinds or curtains, but do not let them block window ventilation
- keep the use of electric lighting to a minimum
- switch off all electrical equipment, including computers, monitors and printers when not in use – equipment should not be left in 'standby mode' as this generates heat
- if possible, use those spaces which are less likely to overheat, and adjust the layout of spaces to avoid direct sunlight on children
- oscillating mechanical fans can be used to increase air movement if temperatures are below 35°C – at temperatures above 35°C fans may not prevent heat-related illness and may worsen dehydration
- encourage children to eat normally and drink plenty of cool water

The temperature may not reach the predicted levels but it is always good to be prepared.
