# Need to Know Mrs Ttoffali's Weekly Update To Park Primary's Community



Happy Friday and thank goodness that it is Friday as, this week, it has felt like all seasons in 5 days. The weather has thrown everything at us which has been particularly challenging for all the children who have been out on visits this week. Well done Year 4 for tackling the rain and wind on top of the 'daily swim'; we are sure you will all sleep well this weekend! Sorry too to those of you who were all geared up to go to the Park when it was closed. Hopefully the wind will give us a little break from it for a while.

Well done to the two classes which kicked off our Sharing Assemblies today. Thank you Pasteur and Pankhurst, it's never easy being the first but thank you for sharing your learning and well done.

As I have watched many of you collect your children this week I was reminded of something that I often state at the start of an academic year.: rather than asking your child 'How was your day?', you might find that you get a better response if you reframe the question.

Perhaps try:

'What was the best thing about your day today?' What three things did you spend most of your time doing today?'

'What did you do today that you can be proud of?' I give these as examples as, for many years, I asked my children 'How was your day?' and the response was invariably 'Alright.', 'Okay' etc and it took me years to appreciate that if I just reworded the question, there was a bigger requirement of a more comprehensive response. I am not trying to tell you how to speak to your children, of course, but I am

saying that the talk may be enriched through a few simple words.

What don't you give it a go?

We are very proud of our school and we were very pleased to welcome <u>Ofsted</u> in the Summer Term last academic year. We were also very proud to receive <u>a letter</u> from Vik Verma (The Interim Director of Children and Young People's Services Newham) which speaks of our school as one with a 'huge heart'. I feel very happy for Park to be viewed in this way. Please do read the letter if you get a chance.

Whilst I am talking about our pride, both in ourselves and your children, I would like to flag up the Reception 2024 information sessions that we have coming up over the next few months.

Do you have a child due to start in **Reception**, **September 2024**? If yes, or you know someone who does, please take note of the flyer linked and book onto one of our information sessions.

Ofsted (May 2023) graded Behaviour and Attitudes at Park as 'outstanding'. Most of the work we do with the children, relating to behaviour and the children's attitudes to their learning, is founded in the relationships which we build. At the root of this work is our Relationships and Positive Behaviour Policy. Please take a look at this when you have a moment so that you are familiar with our processes for establishing and maintaining the very best behaviour and consistent expectations. 


