#### Fire Brigade in school for Year 2 and Year 5

Year 2 and Year 5 had a visit from Sandra, who works as an Education Officer for the London Fire Brigade. She spoke to children about how to keep their homes and themselves safe. It was great to see how much the children learned from the session.

If the result recommends that a Home Fire Safety Visit is required, the service is booked by the parents/carers to their home and will be carried out either by Firefighters from the closest local fire station or by Community Safety Officers from London Fire Brigade. They will provide fire safety advice to the adults and children in the home and fit smoke alarms where needed. The visits and smoke alarms are completely free of charge.
